Position Overview

As a Life Skills Class Instructor you will support survivors by teaching essential life skills that promote safety and stabilization. Your role will be instrumental in helping survivors gain confidence.

Responsibilities

Class Development:

- Collaborate with the Residential Coordinator and/or Case Manager to utilize our curriculum that addresses key life skills.
- Deliver lessons that cater to the needs and interests of survivors.

Instruction and Facilitation:

- Lead life skills classes, delivering content in a compassionate and supportive manner to foster a positive learning environment.
- Patience with survivors in class allowing space if they choose not to participate.

Resource Preparation

- Prepare and gather necessary materials and resources for each class, including handouts, worksheets, and any required supplies.
- Utilize a variety of delivery methods to accommodate different learning styles and abilities.

Collaboration and Communication:

- Work collaboratively with staff and other volunteers to ensure that classes align with Project Light's mission and values.
- Communicate effectively with the staff regarding participant needs, and any challenges encountered.

Training and Orientation

- Attend mandatory volunteer orientation and any additional training related to life skills education and trauma-informed care.
- Stay informed about Project Light's mission, policies, and services to provide accurate information and support to survivors.

Supportive Environment

- Foster a safe and welcoming classroom atmosphere where survivors feel comfortable.
- Kind, patient and compassionate delivery is vital.

Qualifications

- Experience in teaching, training, or facilitating workshops is preferred, but not required.
- Strong interpersonal skills, communicating kindly and respectfully.
- Knowledge of life skills development and understanding of the challenges faced by survivors of trafficking is a plus.
- A commitment to maintaining confidentiality and respecting the privacy of survivors.
